



We've fought a hundred times over stopping and not seeing each other, but we always end up back together, no matter how bad the previous fight was. Why can't we walk away? Why is this so hard to stop?

E. Jean responds with the following:

Miss Caught, My Cauliflower: Halt! You're marrying the wrong man. Marry the man with whom you fight "a hundred times" because you can't cease seeing each other. Marry the man with whom you "can't stop having sex." Marry the man with whom you "always end up back together." Marry the man your DNA is shouting for you to marry, and your chances for happiness are damn good. Why is this advice wrong?

- True love is often incorrectly thought of as passionate love.
- We become so wrapped up in passionate love because it is literally a drug (causes the release of dopamine).
- Since it is a drug, like all drugs, its affect will fade.
- Therefore, true love is not "passion that lasts forever" since that is impossible.
- True love is "the affection we feel for those with whom our lives are deeply intertwined."
